LEED Certification is when a developed area of land meets certain requirements that classify it as environmentally friendly. LEED Certification can be achieved through new construction as well as with existing buildings. Certification is based on a point system, and to be awarded LEED status, the area must fulfill a certain amount of requirements to accumulate those points.
