2023 MN TRIAD Conference

The 2023 MN TRIAD Conference was held on Wednesday, September 13, 2023 at Black Bear Casino & Resort in Carlton, Minnesota. The conference was sponsored by MN TRIAD and there were 40 attendees from 10 different Minnesota counties, along with great presenters and vendors! The conference started with registration and vendors at 8 AM. This provided an opportunity for everyone to get to know each other and have a chance to check out the vendors before our first speaker.

Our MN TRIAD President, Carlton County Sheriff Kelly Lake, welcomed everyone to the conference with a morning ice-breaker and then introduced our first speaker, who is well-known to many of us - Jay Haapala from AARP. Jay's presentation focused on the Fraud Watch Network and he shared some good reminders and some information new to many of us on frauds and scams. They get 500-1000 reports of fraud per month. The busiest week of the year (Thanksgiving) and the reason why (family members going home and finding out parents have been scammed) surprised many of us. Katie Foy from the Cloquet Area Fire District shared information on Fire and Home Safety. All enjoyed Katie's fun presentation on a very serious subject. We found out why "muscle memory is our friend." (in an emergency, muscle memory will remember, even if you don't)

After a great lunch and vendor time, we started the afternoon with Best Practices, the most important part of our MN TRIAD Conferences. Some great information was shared that was especially helpful to those new to TRIAD. Our next presentation was "On the Road to Safer Senior Driving" by Joanie Somes. Excellent presentation including some vital information on what we can do to counteract the normal changes that occur as we age and what "freezing" is.

We then switched gears and drew for door prizes before our next presentation. Thank you to our TRIAD members and vendors for all the beautiful door prizes.... we had "exactly enough." Marlyn Halvorson, Emergency Management Director with the Carlton

County Sheriff's Office led a fun and interactive session with some simple and easy ways to increase your safety. We especially enjoyed "Use Whatever You Can as a Weapon" and his reminder that "If you're living in fear, you're not living." Our last presentation offered fun for all with Deputy Nils Hansen and K9 Charlie (and the "suspect"). The bite demonstration and information shared was eye-opening for many of us, especially the dog's "view" of bites!

We concluded this year's conference with our MN TRIAD Meeting. Welcome back to our Vice-President Julie Duehring! It was a great meeting with everyone agreeing it was an excellent conference. While there were many familiar faces at the conference, there were also many who were attending a conference for the very first time. It was so great to meet these new "family" members and everyone's belief in and enthusiasm for TRIAD is very much appreciated!
