Standing Up is Not Always Easy with NASW CEO Angelo McClain, PhD, LICSW (1 CE Hour)

For more than a century social work has stood up for the rights and needs of society's most vulnerable individuals, families and communities, leading the way on the most important societal developments and protections. This presentation will review the past successes of the social work profession; current societal challenges and look at opportunities for NASW and social work to stand up for strengthening America's social safety net and challenging social injustice.

Keynote Presenter:

Dr. Angelo McClain previously served six years as Commissioner for the Massachusetts Department of Children and Families, overseeing a budget of \$850 million and a workforce of 3,500 employees to address reports of abuse and neglect for the state's most vulnerable children. Before that, he was Vice President & Executive Director of ValueOptions New Jersey. Dr. McClain grew up in Texas, and is a distinguished alumnus of Cal Farley's Boys Ranch. He holds a BSW from West Texas State University, a MSW from the University of Texas at Arlington, and a PhD in Social Work from Boston College Graduate School of Social Work. He was an adjunct faculty member in the Urban Leadership Program at Simmons College Graduate School of Social Work.
