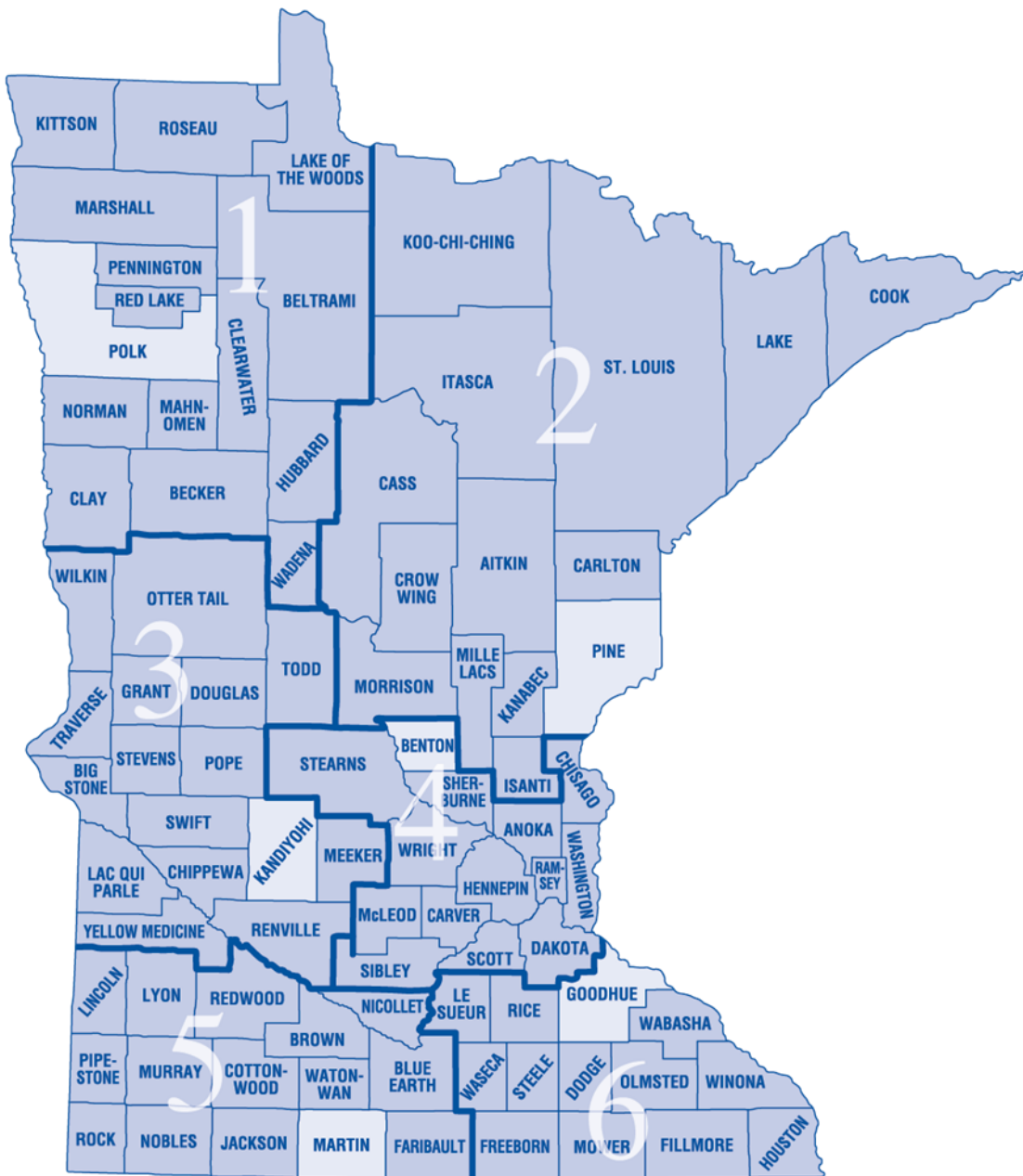

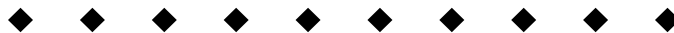

Patty Wetterling is the mother of Jacob Wetterling, who was abducted at the age of 11 by a masked gunman on October 22, 1989 near his home in St. Joseph, Minnesota. Jacob’s remains were discovered on September 2, 2016 on a farm in Paynseville, Minnesota. Since Jacob’s abduction, she has become a nationally-recognized educator on the issues of child abduction and sexual exploitation of children. Patty and her husband, Jerry, co-founded the Jacob Wetterling Resource Center (JWRC) to educate communities about child safety issues. Patty co-founded Team H.O.P.E., a national support group for families of missing children. She also co-founded a book, “When Your Child is Missing: A Family Survival Guide,” along with four other families. She also co-authored the book, “Perspectives on Missing Persons Cases”, released in 2015. Selected by the Minneapolis Star Tribune as one of the “100 Most Influential Minnesotans of the Century,” Patty is also the past Director of Sexual Violence Prevention for the Minnesota Department of Health and was Chairperson of the Board of Directors for the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children from 2012—2015.
