Agency and Location Description: The Erie County Medical Examiner's Office in Buffalo, NY has an immediate opening for an Associate Chief Medical Examiner. The Office serves a population of approximately 900,000 within Erie County, and also provides services to several surrounding counties. The Associate Chief Medical Examiner will join a staff presently consisting of a Division Director, Chief Medical Examiner, Deputy Chief Medical Examiner, 9 full-time investigators, and 3 autopsy technicians, with full toxicology and anthropology capabilities. The Buffalo area offers an outstanding quality of life for residents, and has been rated among the nation's top housing markets with a low cost of living and excellent educational facilities.

Minimum Qualifications: Graduation from a recognized school of medicine, and a license to practice medicine in New York State, plus: Four (4) years of supervised training in an American Council on Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) - accredited Anatomic and Clinical Pathology residency or three (3) years of supervised training in an accredited Anatomic Pathology residency in an institution approved by the American Council on Graduate Medical Education (ACGME).

Special Requirements:

1. Candidates must possess and maintain a valid New York State motor vehicle license and have automotive transportation available for use.
2. Board certification by the American Board of Pathology in Anatomic Pathology/Forensic Pathology (AP/FP) must be achieved within two (2) years of appointment.
3. Successful completion of an ACGME-accredited fellowship in Forensic Pathology.

Workload and Responsibilities: Primary responsibilities include investigation of all facts concerned with unnatural deaths within the County. Render expert medical testimony before grand juries, civil, criminal, and compensation courts. Plan, direct, and participate in various research projects in the field of forensic pathology. Assign and supervise the activities of professional and technical staff. Assist staff with difficult post-mortem examinations and diagnosis. Directs and participates in the instruction of subordinate staff. Manage case load comparable to associates. Participate in the training of attendant professional and technical staff. Teach medical students, interns, and residents.
