Dr. Reck is a veterinarian with a passion for creating new communication avenues with pet owners. She believes that enhancing the communication capabilities of the veterinary profession will foster a stronger connection with pet owners and create an enjoyable professional environment for veterinarians, veterinary technicians, and receptionists. In 2010, Dr. Reck published "Facing Farewell", a book dedicated to providing pet owners with information to assist them with making difficult end of life decisions for their pet. "Facing Farewell" was awarded the Maxwell Medallion of Excellence for the best book in pet care and health by the Dog Writers Association of America at the 2010 Westminster Dog Show. In 2011, Dr. Reck opened the Veterinary Medical Center of Fort Mill, SC. The practice quickly flourished and is now home to four full time associate veterinarians. In 2016, Dr. Reck launched a revolutionary approach to veterinary wellness care called the Healthy Pet Happy Pet ExperienceSM. It is a two-step approach that divides the wellness visit into a one-on-one medically focused veterinary consultation and then separate seminars on key topics of pet care: grooming, nutrition, and training. Dr. Reck is passionate about positive culture development in veterinary practices.

R.F. (Ric) Redden, DVM is one of the rare individuals who is a life-long horseman, a farrier and a veterinarian. His shoeing career began in the early 60s and it has made a profound impact on his medical career. Dr. Redden graduated from the Ohio State University College of Veterinary Medicine in 1974 with distinguished honors in Equine Medicine and Surgery. After graduation, he developed a racetrack lameness practice focused on Thoroughbreds and Standardbreds. His reputation as a lameness consultant quickly spread, and Dr. Redden soon found himself traveling around the world to care for horses with career and life-threatening foot issues. In 1983 he built the International Equine Podiatry Center (IEPC) in Versailles, Ky. It was the first podiatry center dedicated exclusively to the equine foot. Dr. Redden's clinic was dedicated specifically to treating developmental problems in feet, as well as career and life-threatening foot disease and injury. His innovative techniques and concepts have set the benchmark for foot evaluation, treatment and care and have saved the lives of many seemingly hopeless cases where euthanasia appeared to be the only option. Dr. Redden and his wife Nancy organized and hosted 20 Bluegrass Laminitis Symposia in Louisville, Ky. He has organized podiatry seminars in 22 other countries throughout the world, and he continues to share his knowledge and experience through in-depth seminars and workshops.



Edward B. Breitschwerdt, BS, DVM, DACVIM is a professor of medicine and infectious diseases at North Carolina State University College of Veterinary Medicine and adjunct professor of medicine at Duke University Medical Center. He is a Diplomate of the American College of Veterinary Internal Medicine (ACVIM). Dr. Breitschwerdt directs the Intracellular Pathogens Research Laboratory in the Center for Comparative Medicine Institute at North Carolina State University. He also co-directs the Vector Borne Diseases Diagnostic Laboratory and is the director of the NCSU-CVM Biosafety Level 3. For more than 30 years, his research has emphasized vector-transmitted, intracellular pathogens. Most recently, he has contributed to cutting-edge research in the areas of animal and human bartonellosis. In addition to authoring numerous book chapters and proceedings, Dr. Breitschwerdt's research group has published more than 350 manuscripts in peer-reviewed scientific journals. In 2017, he received the American Association of Veterinary Medical Colleges Outstanding Research Award.

Dr. Erin Goodrich is a 2008 graduate of the College of Veterinary Medicine at Cornell, and a 2004 Animal Science graduate of the Cornell College of Agriculture and Life Sciences. She practiced veterinary medicine in a mixed animal practice in Cortland, NY for 5 years. During that time, she provided emergency surgery and routine veterinary care to a variety of species including cattle, horses, some small ruminants and dogs and cats with the majority of her time being allotted to dairy production medicine. Following this experience, she worked at the Day Hollow Animal Hospital in Owego, NY where she further strengthened her small animal skills and continued her interest in dairy medicine as well. She joined Cornell's Animal Health Diagnostic Center in December of 2013 as a member of the Veterinary Support Services team. In this capacity, she works to provide diagnostic support to veterinarians in their daily encounters with disease outbreaks, control and surveillance. She also provides educational outreach to practicing veterinarians in a variety of forms. She teaches courses in the veterinary curriculum to third and fourth year students about diagnostics as well as veterinary care and management issues of the domestic and international donkey--one of her favorite species.
